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Re: Deferred Ontario Implementation Dates for Certain Reliability Standards due to COVID-19

On April 6, NERC submitted a motion requesting FERC defer upcoming implementation deadlines for some Reliability Standards in order to allow registered entities to focus their resources on coronavirus-related priorities.

On April 17, FERC granted that motion. Consequently, the list of standards and their Ontario delayed implementation dates are:

- CIP-005-6 Cyber Security Electronic Security Perimeter(s), by three months (October 1, 2020);
- CIP-010-3 Cyber Security Configuration Change Management and Vulnerability Assessments, by three months (<u>October 1, 2020</u>);
- CIP-013-1 Cyber Security Supply Chain Risk Management, by three months (October 1, 2020);
- PER-006-1 Specific Training for Personnel, by six months (<u>April 1, 2021</u>)
- PRC-002-2 Disturbance Monitoring and Reporting Requirements (phased-in implementation for Requirements R2-R4 and R6-R11), phased-in 50% compliance requirement by six months (<u>July 1, 2021</u>);
- PRC-025-2 Generator Relay Loadability, phased-in implementation of Attachment 1: Relay Settings, Table 1 Options 5b, 14b, 15b, and 16b by six months (<u>April 1, 2021</u>); and
- PRC-027-1 Coordination of Protection Systems for Performance During Faults, by six months (<u>April 1, 2021</u>).
