MMP Status 2003/2004

- 534 MMP *meter installations* require upgrades
- 326 MMPs have selected an exit option and are in various stages of the upgrading process
- 208 MMP *meter installations* have not selected their exit option
- Exit Options - Abandon, Use Hydro One ITs, Purchase or De-register(if embedded).

Measurement Canada IT Temporary Permission Extended

- Granted by MC on June 10, 2004
- Measurement Canada has Extended the Temporary Permission to use non-approved ITs to the end of 2005
- Plan to remove Non-approve ITs to commence in 2006.
- Non-approve ITs can be submitted to MC for pattern approval.
- Hydro One is contractor and is responsible for compliance with the EGIA and all communications with MC and affected MMPs.
- MMPs responsible to ensure compliance with the MR.

Measurement Canada IT Temporary Permission Extended

- Only ITs I/S on Market Start included on temporary permission list. Additions can be made up to the end of 2005.
- Temporary approval ends relative to the earliest seal expiry of the metering installation as follows:

Measurement Canada Compliance



- Hydro One must ensure that all transitional metering installations comply with Measurement Canada regulations
- In 2003, Hydro One obtained permission from Measurement Canada to use 2003 seal expired meters in 2004. (IMO amended the market rules)
- Measurement Canada has made it clear that they will not consider a similar request this year
- To comply with Measurement Canada, Hydro One will replace (like for like) seal expired meters that are not expected to be upgraded before the end of the year (Approx. 450 meters)
