General Comments/Feedback

As included in our January submission, any changes to published data must continue to support fair, efficient, and competitive outcomes within the IAMs and cannot result in the publication of commercially sensitive information that could impact market participants or competition. The IESO has access to commercially sensitive, proprietary, and confidential information related to market participants including but not limited to information related to assets, offers, costs, operations, commercial arrangements, and contracts. Such confidential information, if made public, could foreseeably harm a market participant including their competitive position within the market. Such information should not be made public.

How information is made available including the timing of release, granularity of data, and aggregation of data could all impact IAMs and market participants. At first glance, certain information may seem benign or not confidential but could still result in unintended, consequential harm. As such, Capital Power recommends that the IESO provide an opportunity for market participants to provide feedback on any potential changes to data or information that they may make available, including the format and granularity of how the data or information will be shared.
