The IESO is continuing engagement on the regional electricity planning currently underway for the [Peel/Halton region](#) (formerly known as GTA West region). A webinar is being held on August 5 at 10:00 am to seek input on a range of potential solutions being considered to meet this region's future electricity needs. Your feedback is important to help shape the development of an Integrated Regional Resource Plan (IRRP) which includes a set of recommended actions to maintain a reliable supply of electricity for the Peel/Halton region over the next 20 years. The August 5 webinar follows an [earlier webinar](#) held in March 2020 that sought input on the future electricity needs for communities and stakeholders as well as feedback on the draft engagement plan. The Peel/Halton region roughly encompasses the regional municipalities of Halton and Peel, namely the municipalities of Brampton, Caledon, Halton Hills, Mississauga, Milton, Oakville and Burlington.
