What perspectives do you have on the high-level wire and non-wire options screening for remaining needs as outlined in slides 49 to 51?	It is concerning to see the immediate station capacity needs at several stations and the different needs of the DxV and DxW circuits. This affects growth, densification, GHG emissions reduction and electrification efforts. The load restoration and load security impacts resiliency in the community. Happy to see emphasis on eDSM as it is a cost effective and immediate. More support is needed to push these programs out to sectors and support energy conservation efforts. There are budget and resource constraints at the user level that is limiting CDM initiatives.
What additional information should be considered in the assessment of options for these remaining needs?	Campbell TS DG short circuit limitations are hindering solar PV projects in Guelph. This constraint was identified with both Alectra Utilities and Hydro One several years ago.
