LT2 Window 2 Timing Considerations

- What is the minimum viable period between revised deliverability guidance and LT2 Window 2 proposal submission?
- Is there a general concern with the timing of municipal elections with respect to the Window 2 Proposal Submission Deadline?

Neoen's feedback

- Developers need at least 6 months between a revised deliverability guidance and a proposal submission deadline. Indeed, even though, some work can be anticipated before the issuance of a revised deliverability guidance document, the actual siting of projects is largely informed by the available capacity on the lines. Developers can not develop projects at their normal pace and put money at risk without visibility on the deliverability of those projects.
- Municipal elections in October 2026 will probably mean that municipalities will not be able to issue MSRs between June and December 2026.
- Given the above circumstances, we recommend that the proposal submission deadline for the LT2 Window 2 Energy RFP should occur at the end of Q1 2027.
- Alternatively, allowing proponents to submit proposals without an MSR and giving them 18
 months to get an MSR post Contract signing date can solve the timing issue related to the
 Municipal elections.
