General Comments/Feedback

- The IESO proposed: "If the Proponent is awarded an LT2 Contract and the Municipal Project Lands are designated as [prime agricultural area], they will be required to provide the IESO with a **Form of AIA Confirmation Certificate** (Exhibit S of the LT2 Contract) confirming that the AIA has been reviewed to the satisfaction of the Local Municipality, by no later than the [18] month anniversary of the Contract Date."
- CanREA recommendation: If a proponent and supportive host municipality determine that project lands should be rezoned in order to proceed with a project proposal, CanREA submits that the rezoning should not be required to be completed by the proposal submission due date. Rather, the rezoning should be completed by no later than the 18 month anniversary of the Contract Date. In other words, procurement rules should permit proponents to submit project proposals with municipal support confirmations which indicate host municipality commitment to rezone project lands within 18 months, should a contract be awarded. This is consistent with development processes in other sectors.
