How is a decision made on whether a project is within a PAA or not? For example, if a Lower Tier Municipality advises that a project is not within a PAA but the Upper Tier says it is (or vice versa).

General Comments/Feedback

Thank you for the work by IESO and OMAFA to clarify and provide details on agricultural lands. We would also note that a Municipality may wish to rezone an area to remove it from PAA and it should be at their discretion to do so. To enable this in the LT2 timeline, rezoning should not be required to be completed by the proposal submission due date – a commitment from the Municipality on their intention to do so if the project secures a PPA should be sufficient. This respects Municipal authority over the lands in their jurisdiction.
