General Comments/Feedback

FirstLight's comments and feedback are aimed at clarifications on "Canadian companies" in Bill 5 and more specifically participation from US-based companies in upcoming IESO led generation procurements. During the May 21, 2025, webinar, the IESO verbally shared that it will be developing a mechanism to incentivize and define "Canadian Companies" in the LT2 Window 1 RFP. This replaces the possibility and ends speculation of a ban on US company participation in the RFP. We understand that further details are expected to follow in advance of posting the final procurement documents.

FirstLight understands the IESO is currently developing a mechanism that would incentivize Canadian companies for future generation procurements. The IESO is in the process of drafting a "Canadian Company" definition with new incentive-based criteria.

FirstLight's suggestion is that the test for being a "Canadian Company" include a Control test whereby if the project entity is ultimately Controlled by a legal entity formed and existing under the laws of Canada then it is automatically deemed a Canadian Company. The definition of "Controlled" should follow the classic definition of Control set out in Section 1(5) of the Business Corporations Act of Ontario (RSO 1990, c B.16 | Business Corporations Act | CanLII) as follows:

Control

(5) For the purposes of this Act, a body corporate shall be deemed to be controlled by another person or by two or more bodies corporate if, but only if,

- (a) voting securities of the first-mentioned body corporate carrying more than 50 per cent of the votes for the election of directors are held, other than by way of security only, by or for the benefit of such other person or by or for the benefit of such other bodies corporate; and
- (b) the votes carried by such securities are sufficient, if exercised, to elect a majority of the board of directors of the first-mentioned body corporate. R.S.O. 1990, c. B.16, s. 1 (5).
