General Comments/Feedback

I find the selection process, as described, to be opaque, and does not provide any opportunity for comment by municipalities, prior to granting contracts to projects within those municipalities. Nor does the selection process provide any opportunity for comment from the rural residents in those municipalities who live in proximity to these projects.

This process will be seen by municipalities, and their residents, as an exercise in expediency with no consideration for their input or concerns. Selecting projects for MT2 contracts behind closed doors risks alienating municipalities at a time when the IESO plans to procure an additional 5000 MW of new generating capacity and will be looking at the municipalities to host the new projects.

My suggestion would be for the IESO to provide correspondence to inform any municipality that currently hosts a project under consideration for an MT2 contract. This would allow the municipalities to include the correspondence in an upcoming council meeting agenda, allowing the Councillors and the residents to provide feedback on any particular concerns they may have.
