

Regional Electricity Planning for South Georgian Bay/Muskoka

Regional electricity planning continues for the [South Georgian Bay/Muskoka region](#) in the [Barrie/Innisfil](#) and [Parry Sound/Muskoka](#) sub-regions. Engagement webinars are being held to provide an update on each long-term electricity plan – Integrated Regional Resource Plan (IRRP) - and to discuss and seek feedback on the proposed recommendations to meet local needs. This will be the final webinar as part of the engagement initiative to finalize each IRRP in May 2022.

All interested parties are invited and encouraged to participate including, but not limited to, local municipalities, Indigenous communities, businesses, stakeholders and members of the general public. The study areas are defined by electrical infrastructure boundaries, and roughly encompass the following municipalities:

The **Parry Sound/Muskoka sub-region** includes the townships of the Archipelago, Algonquin Highlands, Armour, Carling, Georgian Bay, Joly, Lake of Bays, McKellar, McMurrich-Monteith, Minden Hills, Muskoka Lakes, Oro-Medonte, Perry, Ramara, Ryerson, Seguin, Severn, Strong, Tay, Tiny, and the United Townships of Dysart, Dudley, Harcourt, Guilford, Harburn, Bruton, Havelock, Eyre and Clyde, the villages of Burk's Falls, and Sundridge, the towns of Bracebridge, Gravenhurst, Huntsville, Kearney, Midland, Parry Sound, and Penetanguishene, the municipalities of Highland East, Magnetawan, McDougall, and Whitestone, as well as the City of Orillia.

The **Barrie/Innisfil sub-region** includes the townships of Essa, Springwater, Clearview, Mulmur, and Adjala-Tosorontio, the towns of Innisfil, New Tecumseth, and Bradford West Gwillimbury, as well as the City of Barrie.
