What additional information, if any, should be incorporated in the proposed electricity demand scenarios? What are some of your key developments, projects or initiatives that should be considered in developing an electricity demand forecast for the Toronto region?	I sent an email to IESO Engagement after the webinar to Rouselle, Carla, Megan and Denise, briefly outlining what EverGreen Energy can do to help Toronto with no wired connections.
